#### **RACIAL EQUITY DIALOGUE (RED) TEAM**

The intent of the Racial Equity Dialogue (RED) Team is to fulfill the Presbyterian Women purpose by "building an inclusive, caring community" that works for justice & peace using dialogue as a tool for building relationships among & between women from different racial-ethnic groups and backgrounds. The RED representatives for the Synod of the Northeast are Magdalene Lewis from the Presbytery for New York City and Donna Vize Wasik from the Presbytery for Southern New Jersey. Magdalene and Donna are excited and humbled to have the opportunity to gather with our PW siblings in building a RED community.

We held our first Synod wide RED Team meeting on Sunday, February 16<sup>th</sup> via Zoom. Activities included dialogues identifying cultural similarities & differences that influence our lives. We learned of the challenges faced by Presbyterian Women who are rebuilding and rejuvenating their fellowships after years of limited in person events. Attendees engaged in interactive exercise on the use of restorative communication to build healthy relationships in our families, schools, and community. Multiple resources including PW's Justice & Peace Calendar, worship prayers, and ideas for promoting racial equity in worship and service activities were shared with attendees for use in their own communities.

Hallie encouraged the women to offer "a penny for every year you have lived, and if that is a secret, bring a dollar!"

#### **Fellowship of the Least Coin Offering**

The Fellowship of the Least Coin has flourished as a global ecumenical women's prayer movement. The key to the movement's success is its simplicity. Individuals or groups may join by committing to pray for peace, justice, and reconciliation among families and communities, and worldwide. Each time a woman prays, she sets aside the least coin of her local currency as a symbol of the prayer. Women's national groups collect the coins and send them to the central FLC Fund c/o World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland. The prayers offered and the least coins collected support projects for women and children around the world. ## **Haddon Heights First Presbyterian**

The Friendship Circle of Haddon Heights First Presbyterian Church has been supporting the Military Support Group of New Jersey (MSGNJ) for several years. At our monthly meetings we collect requested items and financial donations and one of our members delivers the items for shipment.

The group is a non-profit organization started in 2004 by Karen Jennings, a Marine Mom, when her deployed son wrote to her that many of his fellow marines did not receive packages from home. The Group includes family members of deployed men and women of all branches of the military and veterans from Korea, Vietnam and the Gulf Wars.

They support our deployed troops by collecting small toiletry items, snacks, food, etc. and send care packages to our men and women currently serving overseas.

They also collect new Afghans, blankets and quilts for our injured military in hospitals. People in New Jersey also write letters and send cards.

The MSGNJ participates in local Veterans events, supports local Veterans Hospitals and Homes and attends Military Homecomings. Locally they supply groceries, clothing and school supplies to Military Families at Joint Base McGuire/Dix/Lakehurst.

The sheets (made by Earth Breeze) are easy to use, have safe ingredients, and use recyclable cardboard instead of heavy plastic tubs that don't break down in our environment. This fundraiser supports our Bible study on "Let Justice Roll Down" with awareness of taking better care of our earth. The packs are \$20 each (for use in up to 60 loads), and Earth Breeze will donate ten laundry sheets to shelters & charities for each pack sold.

# First Presbyterian Church of Moorestown

Greetings to our PW Sisters,

First Presbyterian Church of Moorestown held its Winter Gathering on January 13th. Linda Jagiela, former Missions and Outreach Director at FPC, presented on her new workplace—Baker Industries. This nonprofit workforce development program serves 200 hard to employ adults each year. The



program partners with companies to provide cost effective outsourced labor solutions. These are real jobs at a warehouse in Malvern, Pa. In Kensington, Pa., Baker Industries partnered with a homeless shelter to provide the same opportunity for adults coming out of prison, battling substance abuse or struggling with house insecurity. The program is compelling and worthwhile for a Gathering. We collected many new cotton socks for the homeless "woods people" serviced by the Christian Caring Center in Pemberton Township.

Our service Circle provided sandwiches for the Christian Caring Center during code blue. Circle members also made dinners for Seeds of Hope-South Jersey Aftercare a program for men who have been released from prison.

Our Knitting Network created scarves, mittens, hats, preemie blankets, bereavement sets and prayer shawls and blankets for those in need. They set up a mitten tree in our lobby and made many articles which helped to support our missions through a good will offering.



During 2024, we contributed to Good Counsel Home, Dawn's Place, and Little Children of the World. We fulfilled our commitment to PW of the Presbytery for Southern NJ., and collected for the Thank, Birthday and Least Coin Offerings.

# Finding Resilience, Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ

In this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience?

Resilience is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient.

The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.

Joy is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace. [Gal. 5:22-23] Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ.

We will also seek to rediscover our identity.

Identity is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.
