Way of the Week 22: Rest and Reflect


(March 9-16, 2025) Ways Speaker: Leonard Fitts

A Collection of Presbyterian Tidbits

Do you know what liturgical color is associated with Lent? The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and leads up to Easter. Jesus, as part of his spiritual preparation, went into the wilderness for 40 days and nights. Purple is the color symbolic of the Lenten season. It is a color associated with nobility and royalty. The Roman soldiers mocked Jesus with a purple robe (Mark 15:17,20 & John 19: 2,5) decorating him as Jesus King of the Jews. The color purple has been associated with the violet flower that bows its head as a symbol of humility.
